Minutes of the October 26 meeting were e-mailed to all members that week. Copies were reviewed. There were no additions or corrections.

Accomplishments: (update)

- A total of fifty Santa letters, for children at TJ school sponsored by Responsibility, were fulfilled by Academy (8th grade & preschool), Youth Group & Mom'sGroup.
- Thermal clothing was delivered to Casa de los Probes on Nov. 22. (Jerry, Mary-Jo, Luisa, Jim, Dory Miller) Check parish website for pictures.
- Denise coordinated a collection of socks and throw blankets for the homeless, on behalf of Catholic Worker.

Loose Change Collections : (Accounting sheet was distributed.)

• A total of \$1,021.18 was donated in the December collection. Half will be given to Hogar infantile la Gloria orphanage and the other half will be given to "Advancing Students Forward (ASF) their scholarship fund.

• It was decided to designate Catholic Charities Rachel Home (homeless women) for the January collection. It is too late to put it in the parish bulletin but an announcement will be made from the pulpit the weekend of Jan. 4th and the boxes will have the designation printed on them.

Lenten Program: (discussion, suggestions, input from Pastoral Council members, etc.)

Decisions:

• Have a parish dinner and launch of Rice Bowl and speaker series on Friday, February 20. Will try to involve other parish groups in assisting with this fish taco dinner. Ideas discussed: show video explaining CRS Rice Bowl, advertise the countries designated for Rice Bowl this year and possibly have samples of dishes, invite some local priests who can witness to the work of CRS in their respective countries, etc.

• Have guest speakers, representing the ministries we choose, on the four following Fridays: (February 27, March 6, 13, & 20) Fish taco dinners will be available prior to each presentation.

• Possibly have samples of ethnic dishes and some information concerning the Rice Bowl country designated each week, prior to the presentation

• On Friday, March 27 have a simple soup and salad dinner followed by a 30 minute Taize Prayer Service. Sister La Vern will coordinate.

Anne distributed a list of all the ministries we have invited in previous years. It was reviewed and discussed while considering who should be invited this Lent. Interfaith Shelter Network:

Various churches host a shelter, for two weeks each, during cold weather for homeless families who are recommended by respective case workers. Vista La Mesa Christian Church hosts each year and the dates this year are January 3-17. We, and other churches that do not host, are asked to help out with meals and overnight supervision. The specific dates / needs will be e-mailed with a request to volunteer, if possible. FYI: Catholic Churches in East County who host are Our Lady of Grace, Santa Sophia, Holy Trinity. In La Mesa, United Methodist Church also hosts.
